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University policy on Open Access



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
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Whichever you choose, the University asks researchers to **Act on Acceptance** and deposit the accepted manuscript in the Oxford University Research Archive (ORA) for the REF, for preservation, dissemination and a comprehensive record for Oxford.

DESIGNATED OA FUNDING

Each granting body sets its own OA policy. Some allow you to include OA charges in grant proposals, e.g. European Research Council. The UK Research Councils, Wellcome Trust and Charity Open Access Fund (COAF) do not; they provide block grants to research institutions including Oxford.



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
